Care Manager (LCSW)

Job Summary:

The Care Manager is a member of a multi-disciplinary team providing comprehensive services in a behavioral health program known as IMPACT. The IMPACT program at CHCCW has received national recognition and needs the right individual to help them continue to expand their services. The Care Manager will conduct needs assessment, develop treatment plans congruent to the assessment and carry out direct case management service delivery. The Care Manager will maintain accurate and timely documentation aligned with the patient's treatment plan. The Care Manager will assist the patient in the reduction of symptoms related to depression and increase quality of life. Consulting services to CHCCW professional staff will also be made available to optimize continuity of patient care. Individual responsibility is fostered, while steps are taken to assure that patient needs are met and remediation is facilitated.

Essential Functions:

- Ability to work within a multi-disciplinary medical team;
- Effective written and verbal communication skills;
- Ability to work independently and be self-directed;
- Experience with diverse socio-economic backgrounds;
- Experience with all age groups, different cultures and socio-economic groups;
- A strong understanding of the interrelationship among physiological and psychological conditions;
- Experience using a variety of engagement models
- Assist in maintaining compliance with the clinical guidelines and procedures of CHCCW;
- Assist in the provision of a broad spectrum of services to CHCCW patients who are in need of such assistance. Such services may involve housing assistance, medical appointment follow-through, insurance paperwork, transportation facilitation, linkage to utilities assistance and other areas of patient needs;
- Consults with CHCCW medical staff regarding patient care as it relates to relationships between mental health problems and physical complaints, etiology of problems, etc.;

- Provide information regarding community resources to patients and staff members as needed. Act as an advocate to link patients to other internal and external resources.
- Data entry for both CMTS and patient registries
- Maintain a patient a 1 FTE caseload for IMPACT
- Accepts other duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Education: This position requires a Licensed Clinical Social Worker. The ideal candidate must have experience working in a medical setting; have a working knowledge of medical terminology and biopsychosocial assessment.

Physical Demands:

- To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skills and abilities required. - The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to perform the essential functions of this job successfully. - Work is primarily indoors with prolonged periods of sitting, typing, and viewing a computer monitor. May also involve periods of standing, walking, bending, lifting, pulling, and pushing. Work in a clinical setting has potential for exposure to blood and body fluids, chemicals, and infectious pathogens. Must be able to use protective equipment as required.
